We currently have a BGA liaison, or Green Captain, at nearly every show running on Broadway –but not yours. We are looking for a volunteer to help us bring the green message backstage and learn what the casts and crews at other shows are doing.

## **What is the BGA?**

The Broadway Green Alliance (BGA) educates, motivates and inspires the entire theater community and its patrons to implement environmentally friendlier practices. Did you know the BGA helped change all of the outside and marquee lights on Broadway to energy-efficient ones?! The BGA also helps venues to use greener house cleaning products; instructs shows how to switch to rechargeable batteries; encourages all shows to reduce, reuse, and recycle; and works to keep scenery, costumes and props out of landfills. The BGA also runs a binder exchange program, does free textile and electronic waste recycling, and helps the Tony Awards get greener. Join today and help green Broadway.

## **What is the commitment?**

A show's Green Captain simply commits to helping the cast and crew of their show get a bit greener. We ask the Green Captain to keep in touch and to attend one of our quarterly meetings, when possible. We meet on a Wednesday or Saturday between shows and offer food and drink and usually a guest speaker. And that's it. You will get all the information and backup you need, a BGA t-shirt, and that warm, fuzzy feeling that comes from doing good.
