Greening Shrek Complied by AfterWork Theater, November 2022

AfterWork Theater was selected as a recipient for the 2022 New York City Greening Grant. This opportunity truly helped AfterWork Theater reshape the way that they approached making theatre and how it would impact the environment. Additionally, the practices and projects that were put in place helped spread awareness and conscientiousness in a fun and interactive way.

Q. How did your project go? What was most successful?

A. Our greening project for *Shrek* (aptly named "Greening Shrek!") was a huge success! With the grant, we were able to invest in reusable batteries and charging stations to use in our microphone packs during the performances, and we have been able to reuse the same batteries in our subsequent Summer and Fall productions in 2022, preventing further disposable battery waste this year. We also used part of the grant to invest in the creation of Shrek-specific costume and prop pieces using sustainable materials and repurposing items that were then recycled or reused, along with the purchase of materials from local vendors.

Q. What roadblocks did you face in implementing the project?

A. The only roadblock we faced came from having to spend some time researching then sourcing our materials to be as sustainable as possible, such as reaching out to Material for the Arts and going through their collection, but we did have to settle for a few items to be purchased through Amazon (a huge greenhouse emission contributor). Though it took us time to get these materials, we were still able to get the pieces in time when we needed them and produced a magnificently green show!

Q. How did you share about your greening project with your audiences/community?

A. We shared our greening project with audiences using two methods. First, we shared the BGA Instagram post about receiving the grant, which was reshared by several members of our community. We also shared the post to our Community on Facebook. Second, in our virtual playbill, we included a thank you note to the BGA while also acknowledging the greening grant and what the grant was used for specifically in this production.

AfterWork Theater listed every prop and costume piece beyond what each cast member provided for themselves via their own closets, thrifting, borrowing, or (as a last resort) purchasing.

Here are a few items to note from AfterWork Theater about the list below:

- Make & Mend is a thrift store specializing in crafting. Imagine a Michael's but everything is donated and second-hand. It is located in Massachusetts, so the team accumulated everything they needed into one or very few orders, to minimize the number of shipments.
- We have hundreds of people in our Community as a result of doing shows for ten years, so many of the items listed below were borrowed or donated from our community!
- Our Green Captain collected used moving boxes in order to repurpose for many of the below pieces.
- We have left in the instances where we resorted to an Amazon purchase, to show how rare it was. In each case, recyclable or reusable materials were used.
- We have used the rechargeable batteries for two additional productions since Shrek!
- The set was fully donated by another company that performed their show in the same theater right before us. Our team, then, recycled as much of the set as possible during our Strike.
